Both Marion Thompson (<http://www.leather-works.ca>) and the Cape Breton Centre for Craft & Design forwarded the following information that may be of interest to our members...

There is an RCMP investigation currently underway into attempted fraud in the areas of Victoria County and Inverness County. There are similarities in the methods used for both attempts. This is a precautionary email to be aware and cautious of similar attempts being made.

You are advised that the origin of the fraudulent message is unknown and it is recommended that you not access the hotmail account as its integrity is unknown. The best defense to scams such as this is to delete-unopened-unsolicited e-mail. Do not open any unsolicited e-mail and do not click on any links provided. Internet fraud is happening so be cautious of unsolicited email.

Below is the body of the fraudulent email being circulated. The hotmail account it was received from is mary [\[maryretails1@yahoo.com\]](mailto:maryretails1@yahoo.com).

Lindsay Craig, a mixed media artist whose recent work involves bronze and glass casting, has exhibited her sculptures and paintings in Canada, Germany and the United States. In her 'Playing with Dolls or Made in Canada' series, Craig has cast and mounted glass replicas, each variously adorned, of a childhood baby doll that was originally manufactured by the Reliable Toy Co. Ltd of Toronto in the late 1940's.

Einav Mekori is a glass artist born and raised in Israel. Her infatuation with glass began with her introduction to the form at the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design in Jerusalem, while first majoring in sculpture. In 2004 she moved to Canada and continued her education and glass studies at Sheridan College Institute in Oakville, Ontario. Currently she is an artist in residence at the Harbourfront Center glass studio. Mekori's oversized locket of blown, cut and sandblasted glass are influenced by the rich visualization of Victorian styles in fabric patterns and wallpaper designs.

Trade Show Opportunity  
Northeast Market Center (NEMC)  
Holiday Show - June 21-25, 2008  
Billerica, MA

Nova Scotia Business Inc. (NSBI) in partnership with the Atlantic Craft Trade Show (ACTS) will support the participation of up to ten (10) Nova Scotia based craft & giftware producers in attending a trade show market in Boston, at the Northeast Market Center (NEMC). The companies will participate in a shared, temporary leased space at the NEMC at their quarterly trade show based in Billerica, MA from June 21-25, 2008. The project logistics will be organized and administered by NSBI with assistance from ACTS.

The NEMC Holiday Show is an ideal opportunity for Nova Scotia craft & giftware producers to explore new export markets for their products. The NEMC is well established in the New England market and Nova Scotia producers are known to the NEMC and their buyers, as the center has hosted numerous trade missions from our region. The trade show would include: an educational workshop; meeting with the Canadian Consulate representatives, one-on-one meetings with retail buyers, and potential networking contacts will be made in conjunction with the trade show format.

The NEMC is a permanent showroom for sales reps. in the New England market, so there will be an opportunity for producers to find permanent representation in the market. We are also investigating the opportunity of an additional value-add sales opportunity for participating companies, ie: trunk show or a retail tour.

Nova Scotia Business Inc. will cover all costs related to the trade show set-up and participation at NEMC, including an in market consultant to assist with organizing the trade show set-up and buyer meetings and on-ground transportation costs from Boston to Billerica. Participants pay a \$500 participation fee (payable to Nova Scotia Business Inc.) and are responsible for all costs related to travel to Boston, ie: airfare, accommodations and meals. Producers may qualify for funding assistance for a portion of their travel costs from the Atlantic Craft Trade Show.

Please indicate your interest in participating immediately, by contacting Kelly Carter or Bernard Burton, as we are currently in the process of booking space at the NEMC and the project is limited to only 10 companies.
