A team of seven spinners and knitters will shear the sheep, spin the wool and knit a sweater in one sitting. They will be competing with 15 other teams around the world. Current Canadian record is held by the Toronto Spiders who completed the sweater in just under 6 hours last year! Come out and cheer on your local team and purchase a ticket to win the finished sweater, a Limited Edition plaid wool blanket from MacAusland's woolen mill, or a handwoven shawl. All proceeds go to "Carey Me" a fund which provides assistance to terminally ill patients who wish to receive palliative care at home. The programme is administered by the Valley Regional Hospital Foundation.

Sarah Nettleton will be in the barn giving shearing demonstrations throughout the day.

I am putting out a SOS for a knitter to join us for our Back to Back this year. We have had one member who is unable to participate. If you think you have the stamina to knit with us we really need a seventh team mate. A good knitter should be able to knit around 28 to 32 stitches a minute. Time yourself over several minutes trying to knit swiftly. We have people on the team who are both slower and faster than this, but the object is speed. The slower knitters will probably spin more than knit.

We are also looking for an assessor, this is the person who counts stitches and rows to make sure that we are following the pattern. She usually just puts in a marker at each ten row mark so that she doesn't have to recount, again and again. This job was done by Jali last year.

Both the knitter and assessor have to remain at the event until the sweater is finished, so should be prepared to spend all day. We have some swift knitters on the team so we hope to be done a little earlier this year, and not take 14 hours. We are fortunate to have Delia Burge, Liz Miller, and Marilyn Rand from our spinning pals, and some of the knitters are from the GVF Thursday knitters.

Please drop me a line if you are interested in knitting, or even if you plan to stop by.

Throughout the evening of June 19th, 2009 numbers from 1 to 100 will be drawn, corresponding to the ticket numbers. When a ticket holder hears his or her number called, s/he has 20 seconds to select one object from all the craft displayed. Obviously, if your number is called first, you have 105 objects from which to make your selection, if your number is called last, you make your selection from the 6 objects remaining on the table. A raffle is held to determine who takes home the Final Five items. Every ticket holder is guaranteed to go home with a great piece of craft tucked under his or her arm. And both ticket holders and their guests are eligible to purchase tickets on the Final Five Lottery. Enjoy door prize draws, raffles, entertainment, hors d'oeuvres, and a cash bar. In 2008 we added a bit of A twist to the evening, Ken Schwartz of Two Planks and a Passion fame joined us for a spectacular live auction of select items from our members and supporters. All ticket holders and their guests got in on the bidding action.

After the success of last years event, 117 of our members donated their work, ranging in value from \$50 right on up to \$780, we thought we should get started early. We're determined to have the event meet or exceed our fundraising efforts of 2008 which raised over \$8000 for NSDCC programs and member services. Thanks in advance for your support.

Call for Nominations for 2009 Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia Masterworks Arts Award

The Nova Scotia Masterworks Awards Foundation has provided the following call for nominations for the 2009 Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia Masterworks Arts Award. The award will be presented at the 2009 Creative Nova Scotia Arts Awards Gala and Conference taking place October 24, 2009 in Yarmouth, hosted by the Nova Scotia Arts and Culture Partnership Council.

The Nova Scotia Masterworks Awards Foundation is pleased to call for nominations for the fourth Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia Arts Award. As before, the award is unique in acknowledging a work of art, not a particular artist or body of work. To be eligible, nominations must be postmarked on or before June 30, 2009. All works of art or performances of art with a strong connection to Nova Scotia, having their first public presentation no more than five years prior to the above closing date, are eligible.

Ronald Bourgeois, Chair of the Nova Scotia Masterworks Awards Foundation, noted that "this is a significant prize. Last year, in addition to the \$25,000 awarded to the winner, each of the other four works short-listed by the jury received \$1500". At the 2008 presentation, jury chair Sue Gibson Garvey emphasized the multidisciplinary nature of the award and the diligence of the jury in selecting a winner. She went on to say "Masterworks must be of outstanding quality and artistic maturity; they must exhibit originality and push or extend the boundaries of their particular medium, discipline or genre; and they must have a significant impact in terms of public perception locally, nationally and/or internationally, and of the critical response of their peers."

Her Honour the Honourable Mayann E. Francis, ONS, DHumL, expressed pleasure at the announcement calling for nominations and continued acknowledgement of artistic excellence: "The Lieutenant Governor's Masterworks Arts Award seeks to support, in a significant way, a major work with a strong connection to Nova Scotia. I am delighted that the award will be presented again this year."
