Trade Shows / Missions

Cape Breton Centre for Craft and Design can provide financial assistance to craft businesses for participation in trade shows/missions to develop markets for their products. This applies to wholesale trade shows and certain juried retail shows, provincial or national. Eligible costs for assistance include travel, accommodation, booth fees, and freight up to a specific amount.

Website Development
